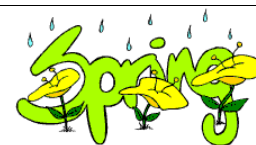

What every LPQG member should know

- ◆ **General meetings** are on the 4th Thursday of every month except November (3rd Thursday) and December (no meeting). Occasionally, there are exceptions to this rule, so check your newsletter carefully. Meetings take place in the Fellowship Hall of Christ the King Lutheran Church, 495 Florida Road in Durango. Social time starts at 5:30 p.m. and the meeting starts at 6:00 p.m.
 - ◆ **Board meetings** take place on the first Thursday of each month at Christ the King Lutheran Church. All members of LPQG are welcome to attend Board meetings, whether they wish to participate or just observe.
 - ◆ **Hives** are casual gatherings of LPQG members, usually held in members' homes once per month. Hives are open to all LPQG members – just contact the hostess to let her know you're coming. Check page 6 of this Newsletter for details on all of the hives currently in existence.
 - ◆ We have a **block of the month** drawing each month. All LPQG members are encouraged to participate. Just pick up a pattern from the program table and make the block for the following month. Then turn in your block at the next meeting before the drawing. The winner of the drawing get all the blocks turned in.
 - ◆ The **Annual Small Quilt Benefit Auction** is held on the first Sunday of June each year. LPQG members are asked to donate a small quilt for the auction, with the proceeds being donated to local charitable organizations.
 - ◆ The **Annual Holiday Party** is held on the third Saturday of December each year, also at Christ the King Lutheran Church. It is a pot-luck luncheon and features an ornament exchange, challenge quilt contest, and Men's Auxiliary.
 - ◆ Our **Outreach** programs are our connection to the community. We make quilts to donate to various organizations each year. Announcements and information are always in the newsletter and at meetings.
 - ◆ We make a **raffle quilt** each year. LPQG members make the raffle quilt and tickets go on sale in early April. The drawing is held at the La Plata County Fair.
 - ◆ LPQG is the Superintendent of the quilt section of **La Plata County Fair**. In this capacity, we take in the quilts, hire judges, hang the quilt display, and protect the quilts during the time the Fair is open to the public.
 - ◆ LPQG has a **quilt show** in the even numbered years during the fall. All LPQG members are encouraged to show their quilts.
 - ◆ LPQG has a **library**, located in the room to side of the Fellowship Hall. All LPQG members are encouraged to use the library and check out books. The library is available any time the church is open, just go to the church office to get the key to the library cabinet.
 - ◆ We wear **nametags** to get to know each other. If you forget to wear yours, you need to pay a quarter at the sign-in table. You can also pick up a sticky nametag there.
 - ◆ The **Hospitality Committee** organizes our snacks for each meeting, plus setting up all the tables and chairs we need. Sign up sheets are passed around regularly, so please be sure to lend a hand.
 - ◆ The **Board of Directors** is here to answer your questions. Please feel free to contact anyone on the Board.

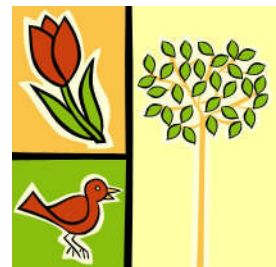
Thanks to so many of you for the positive feedback regarding this years programs. It was a pleasure searching out unique presenters, who were willing to travel to Durango to share their talents and time with us. I made a concerted effort this year to schedule diverse presenters, in an effort to appeal to everyone's interest. I hope that you walk away from each meeting with a fresh bit of information, a renewed appreciation for artists and individual techniques.

I'd also like to share, that the programs this year are more expensive than in years past, with many of our guests traveling from as far as Flagstaff and Denver. Mine has grown recently and I have received a lot of unsolicited advice about its growth and the amount of space it is consuming in my sewing room. My husband seems quite concerned because it keeps accumulating and he is not seeing very many new quilts in the living room or even on our bed. It has pretty much taken over the laundry room storage area also which is pretty big. I also have a friend who prides herself in using all the fabric she purchases within a six month time period and she sees no reason to save any of the scraps. This brings up a second question. What is the smallest scrap size to keep? My friend seems to have unlimited funds available to purchase what ever she wants and does not like to use leftovers from one quilt in a second quilt.

Dear Betty,

Stash Size! I do have a pretty strong opinion on this subject. There are several things to consider when you set limits on your stash size. First of all I will stress that your friend's very poor habits should not drag you down. You probably dealt with peer pressure as a teenager and at this late date in your life you ought to be able to just say "NO" when asked to do something that you know is very wrong. Setting time limits for use may stifle your creativity and that award winning masterpiece may not get created. I would not discard useable scraps because there is always the chance that what you have left will go perfectly into a future project. I usually do not keep scraps smaller than six inches square or strips smaller than two and a half inches wide. I try to store them by color or by theme if that seems more prominent.

Now, your husband is a different issue. I always advise folks to keep the old guy happy. We also know that it is pretty easy to manipulate them. My dearest husband once came into my sewing room and started asking about all the bags of patterns and fabric. "What were they for?" "When would they be put together?" "Were they really necessary?" 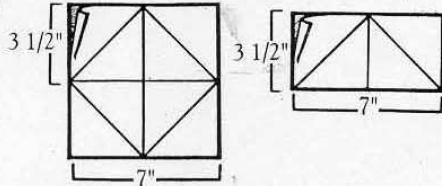

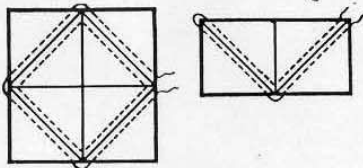
MAY BOW - MAY FLOWERS

① Place right sides together and draw on the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square lines, then draw on the diagonal lines and pin.



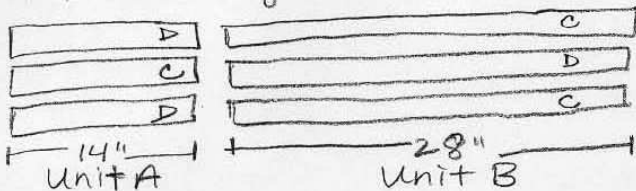
② sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on BOTH sides of the diagonal lines.




③ cut apart on all lines. Press the seams and square to $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

② cut (8) $1\frac{3}{8}$ " sections of unit A and (4) $1\frac{3}{8}$ " sections of unit B. Sew to make (4)  And square to $3\frac{1}{2}$ "



③ cut (4) 3" sections of unit B and square to $3\frac{1}{2}$ "


Lay out the pieces AS indicated to the right. Sew together.



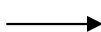
